

PRIVACY POLICY HACK AN EXOPLANET PROJECT

INTRODUCTION

The European Space Agency (herein the "Agency" or "ESA") is an intergovernmental organisation established by its Convention opened for signature in Paris on 30 May 1975 having its headquarters located at 24 rue du Général Bertrand, CS 30798, 75345 Paris Cedex 07, France.

Protection of Personal Data is of great importance for ESA, which strives to ensure a high level of protection as required by the ESA Framework on Personal Data Protection (herein the "ESA PDP Framework") which applies in this field. ESA implements appropriate measures to preserve the rights of data subjects, to ensure the processing of personal data for specified and legitimate purposes, in a not excessive manner, as necessary for the purposes for which the personal data were collected or for which they are further processed, in conditions protecting confidentiality, integrity and safety of personal data and generally to implement the principles set forth in the PDP Framework, available at:

ESA PDP Framework is composed of the following elements:

- the Principles of Personal Data Protection, as adopted by ESA Council Resolution (ESA/C/CCLXVIII/Res.2 (Final)) adopted on 13 June 2017;
- the Rules of Procedure for the Data Protection Supervisory Authority, as adopted by ESA Council Resolution (ESA/C/CCLXVIII/Res.2 (Final)) adopted on 13 June 2017; and
- the Policy on Personal Data Protection adopted by Director General of ESA on 5 February 2018 and effective on 1 March 2018.

This notice is intended to inform you, as data subject, about:

- the identity of the data controller and contact details of ESA Data Protection Officer ("DPO");
- the type of personal data which is collected and processed;
- the modalities of collection of personal data;
- the purpose of the collection and processing;
- the recipients (if any) to whom the personal data of the data subject shall be disclosed;
- the time-limits for storing the personal data;
- the practical modalities of exercising the rights of the data subject under the ESA PDP Framework.

This notice is also enabling ESA to obtain your consent relating to the collection and further processing of your personal data, under ESA PDP Framework. This privacy notice was last updated on: 25 November 2022.



1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1. Whom is the Data Controller?

Your personal data is collected and further processed as shown below upon the decision taken alone by ESA. Thus, the Data Controller is ESA.

1.2. What are the contact details of ESA Data Protection Officer?

According to ESA PDP Framework, your first point of contact concerning personal data matters is the ESA Data Protection Officer ("DPO"), who may be contacted at DPO@esa.int.

1.3. What type of personal data about you is collected and further processed?

The personal data which may be collected and further processed for the purposes mentioned below are in particular:

The submission will consist of the following information:

- Contact details (e-mail address)
- Team name
- School or Organisation name and address
- City
- Country
- Students age range
- Students gender
- Number of team members
- Report: description of the project and images (pictures of individuals are not required for this purpose)
- Cookies

a) After the participation:

- Certification
- Statistics of data (on an aggregated level only)

You are required <u>not to send</u> to the Agency any sensitive information (including information that indicate, directly or indirectly, an individual's racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, adhesion to unions, religious or philosophical beliefs, health life, sexual orientation, genetic or biometric data, criminal convictions).



1.4. How is your personal data collected or processed?

Your personal data may be collected by various means, including via:

- Direct enquiry from ESA's hackanexoplanet@esa.int email;
- Registration to the Hack an Exoplanet Submission Platform (hackanexoplanet.esa.int)
- Direct interaction with the website when submitting a Hack an Exoplanet project to the Hack an Exoplanet Submission Platform

1.5. Why is your personal data collected and processed?

Your personal data are collected and further processed so that:

1.5 A) For the organization and logistics of the Hack an Exoplanet Educational Project:

- Purposes of Data collection and processing by ESA (Data controller 1):
- a) to provide you access to, and enable the use of the website
- b) to provide a user account to enable you to submit a Team project to the Hack an Exoplanet Submission Platform
- c) to determine your eligibility to submit a Hack an Exoplanet project
- d) to record statistics on participation in the Hack an Exoplanet project
- e) to manage your relationship with the Agency as well as your requests and applications in relation to Hack an Exoplanet educational project
- f) to enable your participation in the Hack an Exoplanet educational project
- g) to send you notifications in connection with the Hack an Exoplanet educational project
- *h)* to distribute prizes to the winning teams
- i) to create participation certificates which contain the teacher/mentor and/or the student team names, school/organization name, country.
- j) to highlight and promote the Hack an Exoplanet educational project; to communicate about the Hack an Exoplanet educational project as well as to promote similar events, in the future on any media
- k) to send you newsletters and new features in relation with ESA Education activities
- to conduct surveys
- m) to communicate your personal data to third-party collaborators, contractors and/or partners involved in the organisation of the Hack an Exoplanet educational project or in the fulfilment of any of the other purposes
- n) other purposes that will be disclosed to the personnel when such information is requested
- o) the information is used for aggregated statistics on the use of this website
- p) may be used to categorise the browser on your computer and support us in storing user preferences and usage trends on an aggregated basis.



q) enabling access and participation in the virtual and physical Hack an Exoplanet venues, wherever applicable, as well as interaction with the ESA subject experts supporting the hackathon. This may include webinars and meetings in videoconference.

WDOIT (Data Processor 1), the company providing ESA with the servers where online registration for the *Hack an Exoplanet* project is hosted.

Data involved are: all data contained in the Hack an Exoplanet project registration form.

Hexpoor (Data Processor 2), the company contracted by ESA for storage and shipment of ESA goodies, to ship the student teams and jury members goodies and certificates.

Shipping goodies, prizes and certificates to the student teams (teacher/mentor or school/organization's shipping address, recipient's contact point's email and phone number); shipping thanking goodies to Jury members.

Personal Data involved are: Teacher/Mentor's full name, e-mail address, phone number, school or organisation name and full postal address; Jury member name, email and phone number and full postal address.

1.5 B) For the fulfilment of the purposes and objectives of the ESA Education Programme

Personal Data involved are: Teacher/Mentor's full name, e-mail address, school or organisation name, school or organisation type, subjects of teaching/mentoring, students' age range in aggregated form, gender distribution in student team in aggregated form.

Other purposes that will be disclosed to you if and when such information is requested.

2. THIRD PARTY IT TOOLS, INCLUDING SOCIAL MEDIA

Third party IT tools or social media may be used to inform you and to promote an activity (meeting, event). If you view a video or interact with the social media or other websites, social media or third-party cookies are likely to be installed on your device, covered by third party Terms and Conditions and cookie policies. ESA has no influence over these. Online webinars may be held using a third-party videoconference IT service such as Microsoft Teams or Webex, which process personal data according to their own cookies and privacy policies (available at: https://docs.microsoft.com/en-us/microsoftteams/teams-privacy and https://www.cisco.com/c/en/us/about/legal/privacy-full.html) over which ESA has limited influence and does not necessarily advocate. The Agency does not consider your personal data as an asset for sale and, thus, does not sell your personal data to any third parties.



3. YOUR PERSONAL DATA

3.1. How long do we retain your personal data for?

The Agency may keep your personal data for as long as necessary for the fulfilment of the above-mentioned purposes, and in any case not more than 5 years from the moment of collecting your data. Your Personal Data shall be deleted thereafter.

Exception applies to the photo/video/audio-written records used for communication which will be retained by ESA for as long as the legitimate purpose persists, unless consent is withdrawn by the data subject (or his/her parent/legal guardian when applicable).

3.2. How can you erase, rectify, complete or amend your personal data?

The Agency is keen to collect and process accurate personal data and to keep it updated. You may request the erasure, rectification, completion, or amendment of your personal data if they are inaccurate or incomplete, in relation to the purposes for which they are collected and processed, or if they are processed in violation with the principles referred in the ESA PDP Framework.

If you choose to make a request for the erasure of personal data, you understand and agree that you may no longer be able to participate and share the outcomes of your Hack an Exoplanet project.

You may also be allowed access to your personal data and have the possibility to erase, rectify, complete or amend it, according to the following modalities:

You have registered on the website <u>hackanexoplanet.esa.int</u> and may delete or edit your data by:

- 3. Clicking Log In
- 4. Clicking My Account
- 5. Clicking Delete or Edit
- 6.If you do not remember your password, you can reset your password by clicking the "forgot password" link on the sign in page.
- 7. If you are unable to access your account, please contact hackanexoplanet@esa.int for assistance.



4. IN CASE OF A DATA PROTECTION INCIDENT

In case of a data protection incident, you should contact ESA DPO, as first point of contact, by sending an email to: dpo@esa.int and hackanexoplanet@esa.int.

In case you wish to submit a complaint, you are required to comply with the Rules of Procedure of the Supervisory Authority set forth by ESA PDP Framework. You will be required to demonstrate that a data protection incident occurred in relation to your personal data, following a decision of the Agency or at least to justify serious reasons to believe that such incident occurred.

5. YOUR CONSENT

The processing of personal data described in this privacy notice is based on your consent. You may provide your consent by accepting this privacy notice (selecting the 'I accept' checkbox in the hackanexoplanet.esa.int website) prior to submitting the registration form. You can withdraw such consent by requesting ESA to stop the processing. This will not affect the legitimacy of the personal data processing that took place prior to the withdrawal of user consent. You can withdraw your consent at any time by sending an email to ESA DPO at: dpo@esa.int; copy: hackanexoplanet@esa.int.

If you choose not to give or to withdraw your consent to the collection and processing of your personal data described in this Privacy Notice (with the exceptions of your opt-out options described in Chapter 5), you understand and agree that you will no longer be able to participate in the Hack an Exoplanet project.

For those cases where your consent was not already obtained by ESA (including other modalities) and it is required under the ESA Framework on Personal Data Protection, you agree with the collection and further processing of your personal data.

How and when can you withdraw your consent?

You will be able to withdraw your consent depending on the modality used to collect your personal data, in particular:

- by unsubscribing to the mailing list for Hack an Exoplanet emails
- by deleting your account in <u>hackanexoplanet.esa.int</u>.
- by sending an email to hackanexoplanet@esa.int or DPO@ESA.int.
